

Aprons

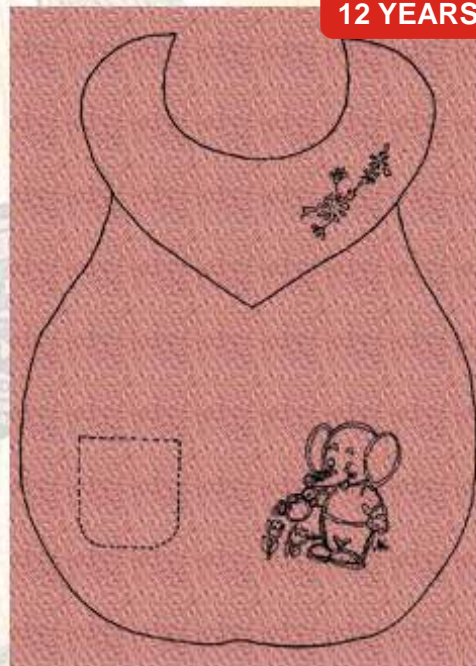
YOU WILL NEED

- *Anchor Stranded Cotton Skeins - 1 skein each of shade numbers 46, 47, 110, 162, 245, 255, 302, 304, 352, 386, 1218 and Black. Use 2 strands throughout.*
- *Embroidery Ring, 8" diameter*
- *Crewel needle no.7*
- *0.5 m each of pink and beige fabric*
- *0.25 m each of red-checks and green-checks fabric*
- *0.5 m cotton lace to match*

HOW TO DO

1. Diagrams 1 and 2 give the complete designs (not actual size) for the aprons respectively. Enlarge the given designs following the grid markings alongside the diagrams. Trace the enlarged designs in place onto the respective fabrics.

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HOW TO DO

2. Mount the fabric onto the embroidery ring for the right tension of stitches. **Work embroidery following the diagrams and key to diagrams.** All parts similar to numbered parts are worked in the same colour and stitch.
3. Dismount the fabric from the embroidery ring on completion of embroidery and press on the wrong side with a hot iron over a damp cloth.



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HOW TO DO

4. Mark 1.5" wide bias strips on both the checked fabrics and cut out sufficient strips and attach bias binding (refer colour picture) following the diagrams.



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HOW TO DO

5. Cut required size of pocket from corresponding fabric and sew in position onto the beige fabric.



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HOW TO DO

6. Gather up cotton lace lightly and sew along the broken lines indicated for the pink apron.



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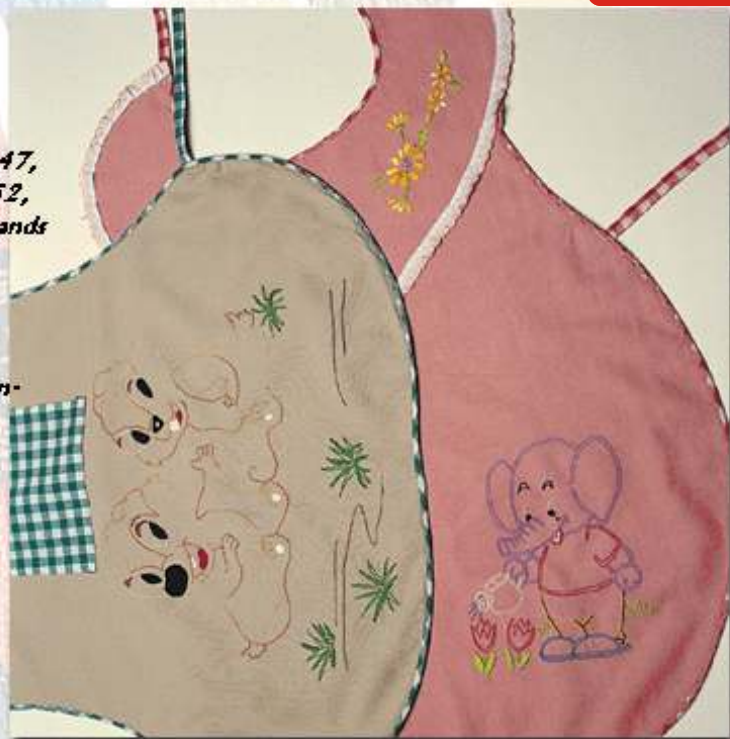
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HOW TO DO

7. Make sufficient lengths of ties from the remaining bias strips and stitch in position onto each of the aprons at the corresponding points for both the aprons.
